The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has completed the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for a multi-use trail along U.S. 17 from State Road (S.R.) 40 in Barberville to the Putnam County Line. This 13.7 mile long multi-use trail will close a gap in the St. Johns River to Sea (SJR2C) Loop Trail.

As part of the Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail system, the SJR2C Loop Trail is a 260-mile multi-use trail system that will link together several communities including St. Augustine, Daytona Beach, Titusville, DeLand and Palatka.

The trail alternatives developed during this PD&E Study and the associated social, economic and environmental analyses, were evaluated according to the requirements of FDOT's PD&E Manual. Alternatives were presented at a public meeting held in May 2019. After receiving and considering input from local partners, residents and various stakeholders a recommended alternative was selected.



The recommended alternative proposes a 12-foot–wide paved multi-use trail located along the east (northbound) side of U.S. 17. The project is now eligible to advance to the design phase as funding becomes available.
