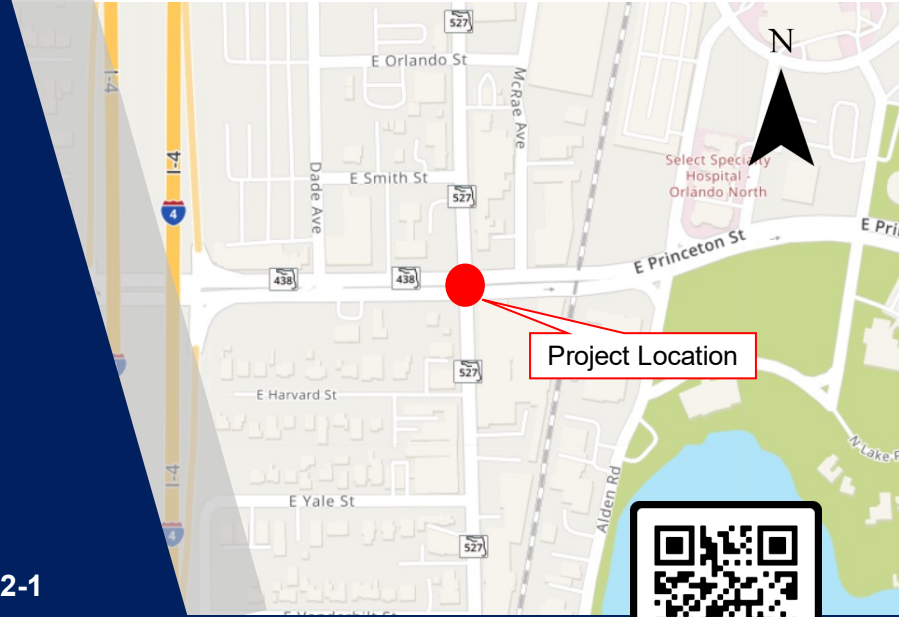




Orange Avenue (S.R. 527) Intersection Improvements at Princeton Street (S.R. 438)

Project Description

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is planning improvements to enhance safety and improve efficiency at the intersection of Orange Avenue (State Road (S.R.) 527) and Princeton Street (S.R. 438) in Orlando. The project proposes to replace and upgrade the traffic signals with new signal poles and to construct a traffic separator on Orange Avenue between the southbound left turn lane and northbound lanes north of Princeton Street. The separator will prevent left turns onto northbound Orange Avenue from one driveway.

Sidewalk curb ramps are to be upgraded and reconstructed in accordance with current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. Additionally, new pedestrian signals and providing a leading pedestrian interval in the signal timing to allow pedestrians to begin crossing while all traffic is stopped will help to improve pedestrian safety at the intersection. Other improvements include resurfacing the intersection and upgrading drainage.
