
A Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study is an environmental and engineering process used to document social, economic, and environmental impacts associated with a proposed transportation improvement project.




Preferred Typical Section Pioneer Trail

Preferred Bridge Typical Section





 - Pioneer Trail (8VO07660)
 - Neither were recommended for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP)
 - The project will have NO EFFECT on NRHP-listed or –eligible historic properties
- Archeological Resources
 - No artifacts and no archeological sites or occurrences identified

Wetlands and Floodplains

- Wetland Impacts
 - 46.9 acres
 - I7 wetlands affected
- There are two permitted mitigation banks that meet both state and federal criteria to offset impacts from the project
- Floodplain Impacts
 - 7.7 acre-feet of encroachment
- 8.7 acre-feet of compensatory storage will be provided to offset impacts

Air Quality and Noise Evaluations

- ✤ Air Quality
 - Performed using methodology established in the FDOT Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Manual, Part 2, Chapter 19
 - Project is in an attainment area
 - Criteria pollutants under National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) are considered to be at an acceptable level
- Noise Evaluation
 - Completed in accordance with the CFR Title 23, part 772 (23 CFR 772) and Section 335.17, Florida Statutes
 - No noise sensitive areas or noise receptors within the project study area

Utilities

- Utilities within the project area
 - Electric/ Power
 - o Power transmission line on the west side of the interstate
 - Communications
- Coordination with utility owners to minimize impacts
 - Majority of utilities are located within the existing right of way by permit
 - The Florida Power and Light facility is an existing easement
 - City of New Smyrna Beach Utilities Commission power easement in the southwest quadrant

Stormwater and Drainage Evaluation

- St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWMD), FDOT and applicable Volusia County criteria
- Project area within Spruce Creek Watershed in the Northern Coastal Basin
 - Spruce Creek is an Outstanding Florida Water (OFW)
- Wet Detention Ponds
 - Six (6) new proposed and one (1) existing modified
 - Minimize offsite impacts
 - Existing cross drains will be abandoned. New roadside ditches and new cross culverts will be added
- Portions of project lie within 100-year floodplain
 - Five (5) floodplain compensation ponds proposed
 - No adverse impacts are anticipated to the 100-year flood stage


